

GLASS SINK CARE & MAINTENANCE GUIDE

Cleaning: In order to prolong the life of your new glass vessel sink, simple and quick daily maintenance is the key to keep your sink in its beautiful original condition. Make sure you rinse your sink out after each use, if water spots appear you can wipe them off with a towel or dry cloth. About once a week clean your sink with a soapy soft sponge (not medium or hard), anti-bacterial hand or dish soap is preferred, then rinse thoroughly with hot/warm water. You may dry it with a towel or a dry cloth afterwards. This will help eliminate water spots and streaks while the sink is in use.

Abrasive bathroom cleaners will scour and dull the finish of the glass, causing it to lose its high luster and shine. Some cleaners may also scratch the surface of the sink. Avoid using these types of abrasives or cleaners. DO NOT apply force when cleaning your sink as it could lead to cracking or chipping in the future.

Stains: Although not common, stains may start to appear on your glass sink. These stains are caused by mineral deposits from your water and can be cleaned with a non abrasive pad and cleaner such as soft scrub.

Chips or cracks: Do not put extremely hot water or quick temperature changes in your sink. This could lead to a possible chip or crack in your sink. If by chance your sink does chip or crack, a resin filler will be required to prevent the damage from getting worse. Steps similar to an auto glass windshield, repairs are recommended to be done by a professional.

What NOT to use when you're cleaning your glass sink:

- ◆ Coarse cleaners with grit
- ◆ Acidic chemicals
- ◆ Steel wool
- ◆ Brillo pads
- ◆ Wire brushes
- ◆ Abrasive pads
- ◆ Pumice products
